Guatemala, 1954: CIA/United Fruit supports coup against freely-elected Jacobo Arbenz, who is replaced by Colonel Carlos Armas

Cuba, 1961: Bay of Pigs invasion. (Also, in 1906: Placed under US occupation; country led by US governor, Charles Magoon, for 3 years.)

South Vietnam, 1964: Tonkin Gulf Incident leads to escalation of war against the North.

Chile, 1964: US funding supports election of Montalva. (In 1973, US supports coup against Allende, installing Pinochet.)

Honduras, 1960s: Used as training base for pro-USA revolutionaries sent to other Latin America countries.

Angola, 1975: US supports FNLA and UNITA, insurgents opposing MPLA.

Afghanistan, 1979: US supports rebel forces against USSR-supported government.

Nicaragua, 1981: US supports Contra rebels against left-wing government. (Also, in 1909: US supports conservative forces rebelling against President Zelaya. US Marines occupy country from 1912-1933.)

Grenada, 1983: US invasion in response to construction of a landing strip for commercial aircraft.

Iraq, 2003: US launches Operation Iraqi Freedom to nab nonexistent WMD from Saddam Husein.
